Cotes du Rhone Rouge, Parcelles 38, Vignobles Jerome Quiot, 2008, France	23.95
A blend of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvedre, this is serious Cotes du Rhone, full flavoured with great structure to support the ample fruit.	
Rioja Crianza, Vina Amates 2007, Spain	26.95
Aged in American oak barrels for 12 months, with a further 12 months in bottle, creating a smooth Rioja with vanilla and chocolate nose.	
Carmenere, Barrel Select, Santa Ema, 2009, Chile	26.95
This epitomises the value and quality which Chile can offer. Superb balance and concentration of black cherries, herbs, spicy black pepper and a touch of chocolate.	
Val Viadero, Toro, oak aged 2007, Spain	27.90
From the neighbouring area to Rioja and using the same grapes, this is a medium-bodied wonderfully classic earthy wine.	
Pinot Noir, Francesca Bay Marlborough 2010, New Zealand	28.90
This classic New Zealand Pinot Noir is grown on selected Marlborough vineyards and is hand harvested and aged in oak casks.	
Meerlust RED, Stellenbosch 2009, South Africa	30.90
Particularly good value, made from young vines which will eventually produce fruit for the far more expensive Rubicon blend. Juicy plum-cassis fruit, fine silky tannins & excellent length.	
Petit Verdot, Ceravolo Estate, Adelaide Plains 2008, Australia	31.95
A rich & spicy wine that leads to a complex palate of peppery fruit, layered with hints of cherry, plum and blackcurrant.	
Shiraz/Viognier, Bloodstone, Gemtree Vineyards, McLaren Vale 2008, Australia	31.95
Open fermented for 10 days then gently pressed into French and American oak for twelve months. McLaren Vale has a cooler more maritime climate than other Australian regions, hence the more restrained peppery style of Shiraz here.	
Fleurie Potel – Aviron Vieilles Vignes 2009, France	35.90
Rich, soft wild berry fruit with a long elegant finish. A great Beaujolais.	
Amarone Della Valpolicella Classico, Adalia, 2005 Italy	68.00
From 30 year-old vines, the grapes are harvested in early October then left to dry on racks until January which concentrates the sugars and flavour. The wine is full and rich with amazing fruit intensity.	
Crozes Hermitage, Domaine Barret, 2008, France	½ bottle 20.50
Aged in barrels, this supple, savoury wine has ripe redcurrant fruit, with hints of liquorice, pepper and spice.

Pinot Grigio Rosato, La Casada 2009, Italy	20.90
An oddity of the wine world that is wonderfully refreshing with crisp acidity.	
Cabernet Rose, Mulderbosch, 2009, South Africa	28.90
Complex layers of strawberry, cherry, roses and fresh peaches on the nose. The wine has a nice, spicy and slightly peppery taste on the palate and is well balanced with a fresh long aftertaste.
