### Wines of the month

#### Pratto, Ca dei Frati, Lake Garda, 2014, Italy

The Dal Cero family has transformed their Ca' dei Frati property, situated on the southern shores of Lake Garda, into a model Italian estate over the past two decades. Back in 1987, they had 12 hectares of vineyard but now, following the purchase of a large chunk of prime vineyard in 2008, they have over 160 hectares. This increase in quantity has been matched by an increase in quality and today they remain the best producer in Lugana.	10.95
The trio of Turbiana 50%, Chardonnay 25% and Sauvignon Blanc 25% gives this wine a lively aromatic quality on the nose with notes of tropical fruit and great minerality. On the palate, an initial hint of sweetness is followed by a well-balanced blend of fruit and savoury components, ending with a hint of stony minerality.	glass

#### 'Carusu Etna' Rosso, Terrazze Dell'Etna, Sicily, 2013, Italy

Terrazze dell'Etna sits on the northwest slopes of Mt. Etna, from 2000 to 3000 feet above sea level overlooking ancient terraces and old vines dropping 250 meters toward the sea.	10.95
This blend of 80% Nerello Mascalese and 20% Nerello Cappuccio is aged 6 months in wood and one year in the bottle before release. The two Nerellos are frequently blended together in Etna DOC with Mascalese described as firmer and Cappuccio as softer. An elegant nose, with delicate notes of varnish perfectly combined with ripe red fruit and spice. Round, soft tannins on the palate end with a delicate finish. The Carusu Etna Rosso is the perfect portrait of the site where it is produced.	glass

- Trebbiano d'Abruzzo Azienda Vinicola Arche DOC 2017, Italy** 18.95  
Super soft, ripe Trebbiano with lovely white pear and apple.
- Chenin Blanc, The Veldt Range, 2017, South Africa** 22.95  
Aromas reminiscent of melon & lychees with soft tropical fruit.
- Sauvignon Blanc, Montes, Casablanca, 2017, Chile** 25.95  
Intense aromatics of herbs and cut grass on the nose, with grapefruit, lime and white peach on the palate.
- Bianco, Amano, Puglia, 2017, Italy** 25.95  
A blend of Fiano Minutolo and Greco. It has plenty of aromas of ripe pears, orange blossom, white peaches and a hint of jasmine on the nose. Crisp clean flavours with concentration and length. A wine that just makes you smile !
- Muscadet, La Roche Blanche, Domaine des Herbauges, 2016, France** 26.95  
Bottled straight of the lees to add extra complexity makes this classic bone dry white wine the perfect companion to shellfish & seafood.
- Pinot Grigio, Tolloy, Sudtirol, Alto Adige, 2017, Italy** 27.95  
A complex pinot grigio with an intense & ample bouquet that transitions from nuances of pear, white peach & melon to delicate floral notes, hand selected grapes from the Italian Dolomites.
- Godello, Bodegas y Vinedos Merayo, 2016, Spain** 27.95  
This inviting, elegant expression of godello offers scents of green apple, pear, and plenty of citrusy spritz. Palate is tart with green herbal notes & ripe, carefully handled fruit beneath.
- Rioja Blanco, Campillo, Fermentado en Barrica, 2016, Spain** 27.95  
This wine brings the freshness and vigour of youth and the nuances provided by its stay for 41 days in fine French oak.
- Gruner Veltliner, Domaine Wachau, Terrassen, 2017, Austria** 29.95  
A light introduction to Gruner Veltliner & the Wachau, fresh, aromatic and racy. Pure drinking pleasure. A fantastic aperitif.
- Malvazija, Gasper, 2015, Slovenia** 28.95  
Malvazija is the local name for Malvasia Istriana. Floral and stone-fruit aromas with lime overtones. The fresh, zesty palate has spring floral characters, yet is well rounded with almond and honey intensity.
- Sauvignon Blanc, Tinpot Hut, Marlborough, 2017, New Zealand** 34.95  
Aromas of passion fruit, blackcurrant, lemongrass and fresh thyme make this a truly stunning example of a Marlborough Sauvignon.
- Chardonnay, Vignoble Peyroli, Mas La Chevaliere, 2014, France** 33.95  
A fine bouquet of white flowers and ripe pear leads to a generous and creamy palate. The finish is long and elegant, with a well balanced acidity to support the stone fruit and floral character.
- Reisling, Organic Trocken, Dreissigacker, 2016, Germany** 35.95  
Ripe, clean scented and zesty. The estate proprietor Jochen Dreissigacker is very proud of his dedicated approach to making organic wines of the highest quality and also outstanding value.
- Gavi di Gavi, Iugarara, Giustiniana, DOCG, 2017, Italy** 36.95  
Tight, nervy and full of energy, and with a delicious core of tongue-teasing preserved lemon and juicy white apple flesh, this is a superior example of Gavi.

<p><b>Vermentino di Sardegna DOC, Tino, Mora &amp; Memo, 2016, Italy</b> The best vermentino comes from Sardinia &amp; this is the best vermentino in Sardinia. Floral lift on the nose with a great oily texture of stone fruit.</p>	37-95
<p><b>Lugana, I Frati, Ca dei Frati, 2016, Italy</b> Light yellow in colour with a concentrated but fresh perfume of white flowers, peaches and ripe lemons. On the palate it has excellent depth and balance, with lovely richness and a crisp, lively finish. A stunning wine from Lake Garda.</p>	39-95
<p><b>Albarino, Pazo Senorans, Rias Baixas, 2016, Spain</b> The leading producer in Rias Baixas in North West Spain, Pazo de Senorans is family run and has been producing wonderfully crafted, award winning, single varietal wines since 1989. Offering a satisfying balance of power and finesse, the palate is lush and round with good body and acidity. Aromas of nectarine, fresh figs, orange zest and white flowers come through on the nose, accompanied by citrus and more exotic tropical fruit flavours on the palate and mineral finish.</p>	41-95
<p><b>Harlem to Hope, B. Vintners, Stellenbosch, 2016, South Africa</b> Gavin Bruwers four way blend of mostly Chenin with Semillon &amp; dry Muscat is a partially barrel fermented number with an appealing floral lift, grapey sweetness, creamy lees and a hint of oak. Stunning !</p>	41-95
<p><b>Pinot Gris, Katz, Clement Klur, Alsace, 2015, France</b> Certified organic and following biodynamic practices, this small estate of just 7 hectares is nestled on steep slopes in the heart of Alsace. A round and tempting wine which is straw yellow in colour. Elegant and flowery nose with hints of acacia and lime. A smooth and fresh palate echoing the exotic lime notes and a sweet fruit finish. A very classy glass of Pinot Gris!</p>	42-95
<p><b>Chablis, Domaine Vincent Dampt, 2015, France</b> Citrus and white fruits with a hint of minerality on the finish. Its nice balance and complexity comes from old vines. Vincent Dampt is one of Chablis' rising stars. The youngest generation of an impressive Chablis lineage, Vincent is the son of Daniel Dampt and grandson of Jean Defaix, both admired Chablis producers.</p>	43-95
<p><b>Sancerre, Domaine Nozay, 2016, France</b> Ripe grapefruit aromas which are also very limestone and flinty in character. Attractive mouth filling texture with real substance and breadth. Quite a serious style here which shows in the finish, charged with zippy, crunchy structure.</p>	43-95
<p><b>Rully, La Chatalienne, Olivier Leflaive, 2013, France</b> Fine, clear, lemon-and-lime in appearance, with a classy, detailed nose, this has lovely integration between fruit and barrel. It fills the mouth, and extends to an enjoyable finish.</p>	47-95
<p><b>Soave Classico, La Rocca, Pieropan, 2014, Italy</b> Classic La Rocca aromas of almond essence and honey lead to an elegant and beautifully balanced palate, with notes of vanilla and almond kernel, ripe apricots and exotic fruit. The long finish has a light mineral edge.</p>	47-95
<p><b>Branco, Quinta das Carvalhas, DOC Douro, 2014, Portugal</b> Not many Douro whites get the heavy bottle treatment like this fine wood-aged wine. It is a half-and-half blend of Gouveio and Viosinho, ripe and with layers of toast and intense yellow fruits as well as citrus acidity. Although full-bodied its freshness and lively acidity derived from this moderately cool vintage, induces a sense of subtleness, finishing with persistent and extensive flavours.</p>	56-95
<p><b>Assyrtiko, Vassaltis, Santorini, 2016, Greece</b> Exquisitely fresh, clean and vibrantly mineral, this gorgeously moreish white screams of Santorini's volcanic terroir. Aromatic aromas of fresh citrus and grapefruit, giving way to a dry, mineral, yet succulent palate, dripping with nectarines, wet stones and sea salt.</p>	59-95

<b>Sangiovese Rubicon, Azienda Vincola Arche 2017, Italy</b> This is a lovely soft, spicy Sangiovese. Dark ruby in colour with herbaceous cherries and violets on the nose.	18.95
<b>Carignan, Vieilles Vignes, Mont Rocher, 2016, France</b> 100% carignan from old vines producing a well-structured wine with dark berry fruit & spice on the palate with a zingy & uplifting finish.	22.95
<b>Merlot, Montes, Colchagua Valley, 2016, Chile</b> Vibrant ruby red in colour, this plummy Merlot has hints of vanilla and chocolate with velvety tannins, crisp acidity and a fragrant finish.	25.95
<b>Mencia, Merayo, DO Bierzo, 2016, Spain</b> From 80yr old vineyards, this red has all the fresh, perfumed characters and ripe red fruit typical of Mencia.	26.95
<b>Cotes du Rhone, Le Reveur, Guillaume Gonnet, 2015, France</b> A blend of Grenache & Syrah, soft but full flavoured with great structure to support the ample fruit.	27.95
<b>Primitivo, Criteri, Schola Sarmienti, Salento, 2015, Italy</b> This has all the wonderful primitivo traits and more. An intense fragrance of rich, dark berry fruit and subtle spice. Well structured and warm, this full bodied red has a classic Italian finish with fine chewy tannins.	27.95
<b>Shiraz, Thistledown, Langhorne Creek, 2014, Australia</b> Great depth of ripe plum and blackberry fruit flavours. A full bodied wine with a succulent palate, lively spices and fine velvety tannins.	29.95
<b>Carmenere Reserve, Barrel Select, Santa Ema, 2016, Chile</b> This epitomises the value and quality which Chile can offer. Superb balance and concentration of black cherries, herbs, spicy black pepper and chocolate.	28.95
<b>Solanera, Vinas Viejas, Bodegas Castano, Yecla, 2015, Spain</b> A blend of 65% Monastrell, 20% low-yield Cabernet Sauvignon and 15% low-yield Garnacha. A beautiful dark shiny red colour, it displays notes of graphite, acacia flowers, black raspberries, blueberries and blackcurrants. Full-bodied and intense on the palate with silky sweet tannins. A stunning wine from the south east corner of Spain.	33.95
<b>Pinot Noir, Tinpot Hut, Marlborough 2015, New Zealand</b> Aromatics of ripe cherry & plum shine through to the palate & are complimented by subtle spicy notes, silky & lingering finish.	34.95
<b>Malbec, Zuccardi Q, Mendoza, 2015, Argentina</b> Deep red, with complex aromas of ripe red fruits. Dark plums and blackberries combine with notes of vanilla and coffee. This expressive wine has firm, sweet tannins giving a delightful finish.	37.95
<b>Rioja Reserva, Bodegas Luis Canas 2012, Spain</b> A delicious Reserva from one of the top Rioja Bodegas. It has a dark berry fruit nose and an elegant, flavourful blackberry and raspberry palate together with complex layers of oak, cocoa and balsam hints. It displays very good structure, real elegance and length.	40.95
<b>Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, Farnese, Colline Teramane, DOCG, 2012, Italy</b> Intense and persistent with a spicy bouquet, and hints of chocolate and tar that complement the vibrant dark fruit character. On the palate it is very well balanced and displays great structure and tannins.	40.95

<p><b>One Man Band, Iona, Elgin, 2011, South Africa</b></p> <p>Syrah, Cab Sauv &amp; Merlot grapes are blended here to produce a delicious silky smooth warming wine with spice and gentle game notes. Layered with fragrant sweet, ripe cherry and blackberry flavours, with almond and white pepper tones. Great with red meat.</p>	45.95
<p><b>Cair, Dominio de Cair Crianza, Ribero del Duero, 2012, Spain</b></p> <p>One of the most award winning wines from the Ribero. Elegant and refined, with an intense and complex nose of blackcurrant fruit, leather and dark chocolate and a wonderfully complex and succulent palate of black fruits with well integrated oak. This wine demonstrates how power and finesse can be brilliantly combined; the flavours go on and on.</p>	49.95
<p><b>Emma, Zuccardi, Paraje Altamira, Mendoza, 2013, Argentina</b></p> <p>A stunning, deep red colour with aromas of ripe, black fruits such as blueberries blackberry and cassis. The weight and texture of the wine are testament to the quality of fruit and well managed oak. It is voluminous and rich with silky tannins and a refreshing acidity. This single vineyard, grand cru style 100% Bonarda is a multiple award winner. A personal favourite !</p>	54.95
<p><b>Shiraz, G.A.M, Mitolo, McLaren Vale, 2013, Australia</b></p> <p>Intense, complex and bright nose of black cherry and blackened cedar wood with complexing dried Mediterranean herbs. The palate is a true reflection of one of the great vintages of the region with immense yet savoury flavours of vanilla, dark plums and dry, earthy flavours reminiscent of the clay soil from which it is grown. Truly memorable !</p>	59.95
<p><b>Rapace, Uccelliera, Toscana IGT, Montalcino, 2011, Italy</b></p> <p>At present Uccelliera is without any doubt one of the top estates of Montalcino, the Brunello and Rosso are complex, intense extremely supple and drinkable. A small quantity of an IGT/proprietary wine, Rapace (meaning "bird of prey" in line with the name of the estate), a blend of Sangiovese, Merlot and Cabernet is also produced. This is an elegant version, laced with graphite, cherry, cedar and loam flavors. Turns lean and firm on the finish, with a chalky sensation emerging. Without doubt a food wine !</p>	69.95
<p><b>Amarone della Valpolicella Classico, Tommasi, 2013, Italy</b></p> <p>Family owned winery using their hillside vineyards for the production of this rich classic wine. Displaying ripe plum and black cherry fruit with notes of mocha, raisin and mineral on the soft luscious finish.</p>	69.95
<p><b>Serpico, Mitolo, Cabernet Sauvignon , McLaren Vale, 2013, Australia</b></p> <p>Serpico, the flagship Mitolo Cabernet, is made using the Amarone technique of drying grapes before fermentation. This process concentrates flavour contributing mid palate plushness, complexity and mouth coating yet silky tannins. It's a unique wine that is rich and structured yet has the balance of elements crucial to the Mitolo style.</p>	69.95
<p><b>Rose</b></p> <p><b>Cotes de Provence Rose, la Source Gabriel, 2016</b></p> <p>La Source Gabriel Rose is a blend of Grenache, Cinsault and Syrah that is organically grown in the classic provence style.</p>	29.95
<p><b>Rosa Dei Frati, Ca dei Frati, Riviera del Garda, 2016, Italy</b></p> <p>Stunning rose, from the shores of Lake Garda, A delicate salmon pink wine that is fresh but full of flavour, showing delicate red berry fruit. Poise and balance in this structured rosé, with a final, persistent note.</p>	39.95

- Meursault, Clos du Cromin, Patrick Javillier, 2015, France** 89.00  
Clos du Cromin is situated at the beginning of the hill of Volnay. Its aromatic power and its exceptional balance make it one of the “Grands Seigneurs” of Burgundy. The nose is expressive with fruit notes. On the palate there are more fruit notes, particularly apple and pear. The palate is round and displays attractive freshness. This wine is balanced, pleasant and persistent on the palate. Its style is classic Meursault.
- Puligny Montrachet, Francois Carillon 1611, 2014, France** 84.00  
The Carillon family has been living in the small village of Puligny-Montrachet in Burgundy's Côte de Beaune since the sixteenth century. François Carillon is the current steward of the family's land and focuses his attention on making fine, lacy Chardonnay. The 2014 Puligny-Montrachet succeeds in being delicate and light bodied as well as concentrated. Its citrus and white stone fruit has the purity of the finest mineral water.
- Suilven, Chardonnay, Thistledown, 2015, Australia** 69.95  
One of those wines that tastes every bit as good as it looks, this Scottish/Aussie collaboration eschews the leaner, reductive, early picked style that is favoured by some winemakers Down Under in favour of something a little more substantial and textured. Deftly oaked, oatmealy and refreshing with a focus and minerality that wouldn't look out of place in the Cote de Beaune.
- Caiarossa, Rosso di Toscana IGT, Caiarossa, 2006, Italy** 79.00  
Situated in the heart of the Val di Cecina, on the Tuscan coast. The winery was founded in 1998 and it was eventually acquired in 2004 by Eric Albada Jelgersma, a Dutch entrepreneur with a great passion for wine and also the owner of Château Giscours and Château du Tertre - two Grand Crus classé in Margaux, Bordeaux. 23% Sangiovese, 22% Cabernet Franc, 21% Merlot, 12% Cabernet Sauvignon. 8% Alicante, 6% Syrah, 6% Petit Verdot and 2% Mourvedre. Aromas of flowers, berries, nuts and mineral. Full-bodied, with chewy tannins and pretty fruit. A hints of wood on the palate, this wine has developed beautifully. Bordeaux meets Tuscany.
- Pinot Noir, Farrside, By Farr, Geelong, 2015, Australia** 89.00  
An elevated offering of pinot noir from By Farr. We all know that whole bunch in fermentation plays a role here, but it's the site/vines that count most for Nick Farr. Love that brambly, forest floor, pickled cherry, sweet spice scent. Has that garrigue, savoury character through and through. Finesse to the max. Svelte, elegance, understated. Delicious, moreish fruit, spice and mineral flavours. Wonderful lingering flavours and aromas. Idiosyncratic in the best possible sense. This is an outstanding wine.
- Chateau Beaucastel, Chateauneuf Du Pape Rouge, 2009, France** 129.00  
Beaucastel is one of the top properties in Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Year after year, they produce a multidimensional, age-worthy wine. Although Mourvèdre and Grenache, at about 30% each, comprise the majority of the blend, Beaucastel uses all 13 grape varieties permitted in the appellation, which may explain the phenomenal complexity of their wines, especially the 2009.
- Chateau Léoville-Barton, St Julien, 2004, France** 129.00  
Anthony Barton was not over-estimating this wine when he compared it to his outstanding 1996 - it is unquestionably of super Second Growth quality. With its more masculine style, this is always the star performer of the Barton brace and the 2004 expresses all that is best about this aristocratic estate. The nose is very fine and displays multi-faceted, lively fruit characteristics. The palate is dense with delicious, ripe, complex blackcurrant fruit and a fabulous, long, cool finish. This is a resounding success for the Barton family and is undoubtedly one of the star wines of the vintage.
