Wines of the month

Olivar, Cesconi, Trentino Alto Adige, 2015, Italy

The four Cesconi brothers have transformed their family estate in the village of Pressano into one of the Dolomites most admired wineries. Today they are making some of Italy's most exciting white wines using organic farming. "Olivar" is a stunning blend of 40% Chardonnay 40% Pinot Gris 20% Pinot Bianco, a light golden wine that shows layered aromas of ripe stone fruit such as apricot and peach, with notes of wild flowers. A fresh citrus character in the mouth is rounded out by the vanilla notes from the very subtle oak ageing and is complimented by a touch of minerality. The long finish is floral and very fragrant. A very beautifully balanced wine, elegance in a glass.

Langhe Nebbiolo, Massolino, DOC, 2016, Italy

This wine is simply a 'declassified' Barolo. It comes from Massolino's younger Barolo vines--covering approx. 2-hectares--in Serralunga. When these vines are old enough they will help produce the Barolo proper. As was the case in 2014 and 2015 some fruit from the older Barolo vines also make it into this cuvée. Like all Massolino Nebbiolo, it is aged in large Slavonian oak casks, although the Langhe only spends 12-18 months in wood, compared with the Barolo's 24+ months. Perhaps unsurprisingly, the style is like a scaled-down Massolino Barolo, one with more immediate fragrance and finesse and less tannin. Built on perfume and finesse, it's a suave, fragrant, cherry and wild strawberry noted Nebbiolo with the savoury, chalky undertow that's so typical of Massolino and Serralunga in general. Indulge !

Aromas of nectarine, fresh figs, orange zest and white flowers come through on the nose, accompanied by citrus and more exotic tropical fruit flavours on the palate and mineral finish.</p>	41-95

<p>Pinot Gris, Katz, Clement Klur, Alsace, 2015, France Certified organic and following biodynamic practices, this small estate of just 7 hectares is nestled on steep slopes in the heart of Alsace. A round and tempting wine which is straw yellow in colour. Elegant and flowery nose with hints of acacia and lime. A smooth and fresh palate echoing the exotic lime notes and a sweet fruit finish. <p>Chablis, Domaine Vincent Dampt, 2015, France Citrus and white fruits with a hint of minerality on the finish. Its nice balance and complexity comes from old vines. Vincent Dampt is one of Chablis' rising stars. <p>Assyrtiko, Vassaltis, Santorini, 2017, Greece Exquisitely fresh, clean and vibrantly mineral, this gorgeously moreish white screams of Santorini's volcanic terroir. Aromatic aromas of fresh citrus and grapefruit, giving way to a dry, mineral, yet succulent palate, dripping with nectarines, wet stones and sea salt.</p>	59-95
<p>Chardonnay 'Collezione Privata', Isole Olena, Tuscany, 2016, Italy Paolo De Marchi grafted Chardonnay onto existing vines on the Isole e Olena estate and 1987 became the first vintage of the 'Collezione De Marchi Chardonnay' Golden in colour with a rich yet minerally perfume on the nose, with aromas of grilled almonds and butter. On the palate, it is full and intense, with a perfect balance between ripe, yellow fruit, buttery biscuits and crisp, minerality.</p>	69-95

Sangiovese Rubicon, Azienda Vincola Arche 2017, Italy	19.95
This is a lovely soft, spicy Sangiovese. Dark ruby in colour with herbaceous cherries and violets on the nose.	
Carignan, Vieilles Vignes, Mont Rocher, 2016, France	22.95
100% carignan from old vines producing a well-structured wine with dark berry fruit & spice on the palate with a zingy & uplifting finish.	
Merlot, Montes, Colchagua Valley, 2016, Chile	25.95
Vibrant ruby red in colour, this plummy Merlot has hints of vanilla and chocolate with velvety tannins, crisp acidity and a fragrant finish.	
Mencia, Merayo, DO Bierzo, 2017, Spain	26.95
From 80yr old vineyards, this red has all the fresh, perfumed characters and ripe red fruit typical of Mencia.	
Cotes du Rhone, Le Reveur, Guillaume Gonnet, 2016, France	27.95
A blend of Grenache & Syrah, soft but full flavoured with great structure to support the ample fruit.	
Primitivo, Criteri, Schola Sarmanti, Salento, 2016, Italy	27.95
This has all the wonderful primitivo traits and more. An intense fragrance of rich, dark berry fruit and subtle spice. Well structured and warm, this full bodied red has a classic Italian finish with fine chewy tannins.	
Shiraz, Thistledown, Langhorne Creek, 2015, Australia	29.95

Solanera, Vinas Viejas, Bodegas Castano, Yecla, 2015, Spain	33.95
A blend of 65% Monastrell, 20% low-yield Cabernet Sauvignon and 15% low-yield Garnacha. A beautiful dark shiny red colour, it displays notes of graphite, acacia flowers, black raspberries, blueberries and blackcurrants. Full-bodied and intense on the palate with silky sweet tannins. Stunning wine from the SE of Spain.	
Papeta, Domaine De la Senche, Minervois, 2015, France	33.95
Grown on the limestone slopes of Borie de Moline, this wine has a unique structure inspired by the flavours of the Minervois. Full-bodied and vibrant with personality, this blend of Syrah and Carignan is a tribute to a very special 'Papeta'	
Pinot Noir, Tinpot Hut, Marlborough 2016, New Zealand	35.95
Aromatics of ripe cherry & plum shine through to the palate & are complimented by subtle spicy notes, silky & lingering finish.	
Malbec, Zuccardi Q, Mendoza, 2015, Argentina	38.95
Deep red, with complex aromas of ripe red fruits. Dark plums and blackberries combine with notes of vanilla and coffee. This expressive wine has firm, sweet tannins giving a delightful finish.	
Rioja Reserva, Bodegas Luis Canas 2012, Spain	41.95
A delicious Reserva from one of the top Rioja Bodegas. It has a dark berry fruit nose and an elegant, flavourful blackberry and raspberry palate together with complex layers of oak, cocoa and balsam hints. Structure, elegance and length.	

Montepulciano d’Abruzzo, Farnese, Colline Teramane, DOCG, 2012, Italy 40.95

Intense and persistent with a spicy bouquet, and hints of chocolate and tar that complement the vibrant dark fruit character. On the palate it is very well balanced and displays great structure and tannins.

One Man Band, Iona, Elgin, 2011, South Africa 46.95

Syrah, Cab Sauv & Merlot grapes are blended here to produce a delicious silky smooth warming wine with spice and gentle game notes. Layered with fragrant sweet, ripe cherry and blackberry flavours, with almond and white pepper tones. Great with red meat.

Canace, Cantina Diomede, Puglia, 2014, Italy 48.95

A deeply red coloured wine which will leave beautiful tears inside your glass. It is of extraordinary complexity, with a bouquet that offers warm spices, cocoa, coffee, liquorice and ripe cherries and plums on the nose. Soft and velvety, almost chocolaty, on the palate, it is full-bodied with fresh acidity and velvety tannins. 85% Nero Di Troia 15% Aglianico

Cair, Dominio de Cair Crianza, Ribero del Duero, 2012, Spain 49.95

One of the most award winning wines from the Ribero. Elegant and refined, with an intense and complex nose of blackcurrant fruit, leather and dark chocolate and a wonderfully complex and succulent palate of black fruits with well integrated oak. This wine demonstrates how power and finesse can be brilliantly combined; the flavours go on and on.

Zinfandel ‘Old Vines’, Seghesio, Sonoma County , 2013, USA 67.95

Although “old vine” is often loosely interpreted in the wine industry, the average age of these vines is approximately 70 years old. Deeply perfumed aromas of raspberry and old vine Zin’s intrinsic briary spiciness. Layered bright fruit flavours reminiscent of a crusted cherry pie with baking spice undertones. Low yields in the vineyard preserved the vibrant natural acidity and balanced tannins, leading into a long, persistent finish.

Amarone della Valpolicella Classico, Tommasi, 2013, Italy 69.95

Family owned winery using their hillside vineyards for the production of this rich classic wine. Displaying ripe plum and black cherry fruit with notes of mocha, raisin and mineral on the soft luscious finish.

Serpico, Mitolo, Cabernet Sauvignon, McLaren Vale, 2013, Australia 69.95

Serpico, the flagship Mitolo Cabernet, is made using the Amarone technique of drying grapes before fermentation. This process concentrates flavour contributing mid palate plushness, complexity and mouth coating yet silky tannins. It’s a unique wine that is rich and structured with great balance, absolutely stunning !

Rose

Cotes de Provence Rose, la Source Gabriel, 2017 31.95

La Source Gabriel Rose is a blend of Grenache, Cinsault and Syrah that is organically grown in the classic Provence style.

Rosa Dei Frati, Ca dei Frati, Riviera del Garda, 2016, Italy 40.95

Stunning rose, from the shores of Lake Garda, A delicate salmon pink wine that is fresh but full of flavour, showing delicate red berry fruit. Poise and balance in this structured rosé, with a final, persistent note.

- Meursault, Clos du Cromin, Patrick Javillier, 2015, France** 89.00
Clos du Cromin is situated at the beginning of the hill of Volnay. Its aromatic power and its exceptional balance make it one of the “Grands Seigneurs” of Burgundy. The nose is expressive with fruit notes. On the palate there are more fruit notes, particularly apple and pear. The palate is round and displays attractive freshness. This wine is balanced, pleasant and persistent on the palate. Its style is classic Meursault.
- Puligny Montrachet, Francois Carillon 1611, 2014, France** 84.00
The Carillon family has been living in the small village of Puligny-Montrachet in Burgundy's Côte de Beaune since the sixteenth century. François Carillon is the current steward of the family's land and focuses his attention on making fine, lacy Chardonnay. The 2014 Puligny-Montrachet succeeds in being delicate and light bodied as well as concentrated.
- Suilven, Chardonnay, Thistledown, 2015, Australia** 69.95
One of those wines that tastes every bit as good as it looks, this Scottish/Aussie collaboration eschews the leaner, reductive, early picked style that is favoured by some winemakers Down Under in favour of something a little more substantial and textured. Deftly oaked, oatmealy and refreshing with a focus and minerality that wouldn't look out of place in Cote de Beaune.
- Brunello di Montalcino, Uccelliera, Toscano, 2011, Italy** 79.00
Sumptuous, full-bodied fruit flavours of strawberries and plums, mixed with salt, spice, tobacco and undergrowth characteristics, finishing on notes of kirsch and crème de mure. A blend of vines with various exposures and soils centred on Castelnuovo del Abate on the south-east side of Montalcino. This is a warm part of Montalcino but the estate's high vineyard range, from 150 to 350 metres above sea level, cool fermentations and use of large casks as well as small barriques, help to make this generous, ripe, moreish and refined.
- Caiarossa, Rosso di Toscana IGT, Caiarossa, 2006, Italy** 79.00
Situated in the heart of the Val di Cecina, on the Tuscan coast. The winery was founded in 1998 and it was eventually acquired in 2004 by Eric Albada Jelgersma, a Dutch entrepreneur with a great passion for wine and also the owner of Château Giscours and Château du Tertre. 23% Sangiovese, 22% Cabernet Franc, 21% Merlot, 12% Cabernet Sauvignon. 8% Alicante, 6% Syrah, 6% Petit Verdot and 2% Mourvedre Aromas of flowers, berries, nuts and mineral. Full-bodied, with chewy tannins and pretty fruit. A hint of wood on the palate, this wine has developed beautifully. Bordeaux meets Tuscany.
- Pinot Noir, Farrside, By Farr, Geelong, 2015, Australia** 89.00
An elevated offering of pinot noir from By Farr. We all know that whole bunch in fermentation plays a role here, but it's the site/vines that count most for Nick Farr. Love that brambly, forest floor, pickled cherry, sweet spice scent. Has that garrigue, savoury character through and through. Finesse to the max. Svelte, elegance, understated. Delicious, moreish fruit, spice and mineral flavours. Wonderful lingering flavours and aromas. This is an outstanding wine.
- Chateau Beaucastel, Chateauneuf Du Pape Rouge, 2010, France** 129.00
Beaucastel is one of the top properties in Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Year after year, they produce a multidimensional, age-worthy wine. Although Mourvèdre and Grenache, at about 30% each, comprise the majority of the blend, Beaucastel uses all 13 grape varieties permitted in the appellation, which may explain the phenomenal complexity of their wines, especially the 2010.
- Chateau Magdelaine, 1er Grand Cru, St Emillion, 2005, France** 159.00
From the stable of Jean-Pierre Moueix (owners of Chateau Petrus), this estate has now been absorbed by the nearby and superb Chateau Belair-Monange. One of only 13 1er Grand Cru Classe St Emillions from the whole region, this wine really shone in the great 2005 vintage. Exhibiting gorgeous kirsch liqueur notes with some plum and Asian spice and dense ruby/garnet to the rim, this 2005 is full-bodied, rich, and bigger and more masculine than this wine tends to be. It is a beauty, with loads of fruit, great purity and texture.
