## Wines

### **Cambrugiano, Verdicchio di Matelic Riserva, Belisario, 2016, Italy** 10.95 glass

Cantine Belisario is the biggest producer of Verdicchio in the Matelica DOC, a smaller zone than nearby Castelli di Jesi (which also produces Verdicchio from the same grape). The climate here is more continental than in Castelli di Jesi and the combination of warm days and cool nights gives a longer growing season, and lovely aromatic qualities to the wines. The wine was aged in a combination of 80% stainless steel and 20% toasted oak barrels for 12 months before bottling. The wine then remained in bottle for one year prior to release. Pale gold in colour, this wine opens with complex aromas of vanilla, honey and fresh floral notes. Full and rounded on the palate with stone fruit flavours and light touches of spiced honey and vanilla on the long finish. 43.95

### **Calafuria, Rosato, Tormaresca, Salento, 2018, Italy** 9.50 Glass

Elegance and vibrancy abound in this Puglian Rose made using 100% Negroamaro grapes. Intense and delicate with fragrant notes of pomegranate, peach, and grapefruit along with floral notes. The palate is initially soft with a pleasing crispness followed by delicately savoury sensations and balanced aromatics. So gorgeous ! 37.95

### **Carusu, Terrazze Delle 'Etna, Sicily 2015, Italy**

Terrazze dell'Etna was founded in 2008 by Nino Bevilacqua, an engineer from Palermo incredibly passionate about this territory and its wine making potential. Fluctuations between warm days and cool nights combined with low vigour volcanic soil and low yielding vines creates wines of great intensity. Using native grapes 80% Nerello Mascalese 20% Nerello Capuccio, Carusu is a vibrant wine with ripe red fruit, spice, soft velvety tannins with a delicate & elegant finish. 6 months in wood and 24 months in bottle this is a perfect portrait of the site where it is produced. If you love Red Burgundy you will love Carusu, enjoy ! 10.95 glass 43.95

Super soft, ripe Trebbiano with lovely white pear and apple.
- Chenin Blanc, Sangoma, 2018, South Africa** 24.95  
Aromas reminiscent of melon & lychees with soft tropical fruit.
- Sauvignon Blanc, Montes, Casablanca, 2018, Chile** 25.95  
Intense aromatics of herbs and cut grass on the nose, with grapefruit, lime and white peach on the palate.
- Bianco, Amano, Puglia, 2018, Italy** 26.95  
A blend of Fiano Minutolo and Greco. It has plenty of aromas of ripe pears, orange blossom, white peaches and a hint of jasmine on the nose. Crisp clean flavours with concentration and length. A wine that just makes you smile !
- Muscadet, La Roche Blanche, Domaine des Herbauges, 2018, France** 26.95  
Bottled straight of the lees to add extra complexity makes this classic bone dry white wine the perfect companion to shellfish & seafood.
- Pinot Grigio, Tolloy, Sudtiro, Alto Adige, 2017, Italy** 29.95  
A complex pinot grigio with an intense & ample bouquet that transitions from nuances of pear, white peach & melon to delicate floral notes, hand selected grapes from the Italian Dolomites
- Godello, Bodegas y Vinedos Merayo, 2017, Spain** 27.95  
This inviting, elegant expression of godello offers scents of green apple, pear, and plenty of citrusy spritz. Palate is tart with green herbal notes & ripe, carefully handled fruit beneath.

This wine is clear and bright with youthful tints and an intense aroma of well-ripened fruit, such as peaches and nectarines. On the palate, it is creamy with aromatic notes of ripe fruit with great concentration.

Invigorating acidity is integrated into the layers of fresh apple, lemon zest and white fleshed fruits. A Picpoul that will grace a dining table or be enjoyed as an aperitif.

Aromas of passion fruit, blackcurrant, lemongrass and fresh thyme make this a truly stunning example of a Marlborough Sauvignon.

<p><b>Lugana, I Frati, Ca dei Frati, 2018, Italy</b>  Light yellow in colour with a concentrated but fresh perfume of white flowers, peaches and ripe lemons. On the palate it has excellent depth and balance, with lovely richness and a crisp, lively finish. A stunning wine from Lake Garda.</p>	39-95
<p><b>Albarino, Pazo Senorans, Rias Baixas, 2018, Spain</b>  The leading producer in Rias Baixas in North West Spain, Pazo de Senorans is family run and has been producing wonderfully crafted, award winning, single varietal wines since 1989. Offering a satisfying balance of power and finesse, the palate is lush and round with good body and acidity. Aromas of nectarine, fresh figs, orange zest and white flowers come through on the nose, accompanied by citrus and more exotic tropical fruit flavours on the palate and mineral finish.</p>	41-95
<p><b>Sancerre, Domaine Nozay, 2017, France</b>  Ripe grapefruit aromas which are also very limestone and flinty in character. Attractive mouth filling texture with real substance and breadth. Quite a serious style here which shows in the finish, charged with zippy, crunchy structure.</p>	43-95
<p><b>Chablis, Domaine Vincent Dampit, 2017, France</b>  Citrus and white fruits with a hint of minerality on the finish. Its nice balance and complexity comes from old vines. Vincent Dampit is one of Chablis' rising stars. The youngest generation of an impressive Chablis lineage, Vincent is the son of Daniel Dampit and grandson of Jean Defaix, both admired Chablis producers.</p>	44-95
<p><b>Gruner Veltliner Federspiel, Hogl, Ried Schon, 2018, Austria</b>  A classic fresh and lively Gruner Veltliner from the Wachau vineyards along the Danube in Weissenkirchen and Loiben. Notes of honeydew and florals, with a lovely, almost creamy nose and a bit of white pepper spice. Fresh and nicely balanced acidity. Great as an aperitif or with food.</p>	44-95
<p><b>Wild Sauvignon, Greywacke, Marlborough, 2016, New Zealand</b>  Fermented entirely with naturally occurring yeast, this is an alternative style of Sauvignon Blanc from Kevin Judd of Cloudy Bay fame, that is both intricate and textural with a rich, succulent palate finishing crisp and long with a flinty dryness.</p>	49-95
<p><b>Fiano Di Avellino, DOCG, Guido Marsella, 2016, Italy</b>  Known as 'Mr Fiano' locally Guido Marsella is devoted to this aromatic white grape. Determined to bring some kudos and pride back to this overlooked variety, he has, over the last 20 years, worked tirelessly in his vineyard on the sun-baked hillsides in the heart of Campania. The nose is reminiscent of ash and incense, roasted hazelnut, smoked, melon, peach and herbaceous on a mineral background. On the palate it is fresh, deep, enveloping and of great energy</p>	47-95
<p><b>Alba Antiqua, Malvasia Istarska, Matosevic, 2014, Croatia</b>  This 100% Istrian Malvasia is skin-fermented for several days, following which it is aged on fine lees in French oak and acacia barrels for 30 months. The wine has extraordinary power and unusual freshness, reminiscent of Malvasias produced in ancient Mediterranean style with a lot of tertiary aromas. Please try !</p>	48-95
<p><b>Soave Classico, La Rocca, Pieropan, 2016, Italy</b>  Classic La Rocca aromas of almond essence and honey lead to an elegant and beautifully balanced palate, with notes of vanilla and almond kernel, ripe apricots and exotic fruit. The long finish has a light mineral edge.</p>	49-95
<p><b>Assyrtiko, Vassaltis, Santorini, 2017, Greece</b>  Exquisitely fresh, clean and vibrantly mineral, this gorgeously moreish white screams of Santorini's volcanic terroir. Aromatic aromas of fresh citrus and grapefruit, giving way to a dry, mineral, yet succulent palate, dripping with nectarines, wet stones and sea salt.</p>	59-95

<b>Sangiovese Rubicon, Azienda Vincola Arche 2017, Italy</b>	20.95
This is a lovely soft, spicy Sangiovese. Dark ruby in colour with herbaceous cherries and violets on the nose.	
<b>Carignan, Vieilles Vignes, Mont Rocher, 2017, France</b>	23.95
100% carignan from old vines producing a well-structured wine with dark berry fruit & spice on the palate with a zingy & uplifting finish.	
<b>Merlot, Montes, Colchagua Valley, 2017, Chile</b>	25.95
Vibrant ruby red in colour, this plummy Merlot has hints of vanilla and chocolate with velvety tannins, crisp acidity and a fragrant finish.	
<b>Mencia, Merayo, DO Bierzo, 2018, Spain</b>	26.95
Made from over 80 year old Mencia bush vines. There is no oak treatment to preserve the aromatic fresh red fruit quality of this variety. Fresh and herbal with a hint of spice on the finish.	
<b>Bonarda Seleccion, Zuccardi, Mendoza, 2017, Argentina</b>	27.95
This Bonarda has a rich violet colour, and exudes sensuous aromas of blueberry and blackberry. It is a vivacious wine, full of pure ripe fruit, yet soft in style.	
<b>Cotes du Rhone, Le Reveur, Guillaume Gonnet, 2017, France</b>	28.95
A blend of Grenache & Syrah, soft but full flavoured with great structure to support the ample fruit.	
<b>Primitivo, Criteri, Schola Sarmanti, Salento, 2017, Italy</b>	29.95
This has all the wonderful primitivo traits and more. An intense fragrance of rich, dark berry fruit and subtle spice. Well structured and warm, this full bodied red has a classic Italian finish with fine chewy tannins.	
<b>Shiraz, Thistledown, Langhorne Creek, 2016, Australia</b>	30.95
Great depth of ripe plum and blackberry fruit flavours. A full bodied wine with a succulent palate, lively spices and fine velvety tannins.	
<b>Solanera, Vinas Viejas, Bodegas Castano, Yecla, 2015, Spain</b>	34.95
A blend of 65% Monastrell, 20% low-yield Cabernet Sauvignon and 15% low-yield Garnacha. A beautiful dark shiny red colour, it displays notes of graphite, acacia flowers, black raspberries, blueberries and blackcurrants. Full-bodied and intense on the palate with silky sweet tannins. Stunning wine from the SE of Spain.	
<b>Pinot Noir, Tinpot Hut, Marlborough 2017, New Zealand</b>	35.95
Aromatics of ripe cherry & plum shine through to the palate & are complimented by subtle spicy notes, silky & lingering finish.	
<b>Malbec, Zuccardi Q, Mendoza, 2016, Argentina</b>	38.95
Deep red, with complex aromas of ripe red fruits. Dark plums and blackberries combine with notes of vanilla and coffee. This expressive wine has firm, sweet tannins giving a delightful finish.	
<b>Rioja Reserva, Bodegas Luis Canas 2013, Spain</b>	42.95

<p><b>Rosa Dei Frati, Ca dei Frati, Riviera del Garda, 2017, Italy</b>          Stunning rose, from the shores of Lake Garda, A delicate salmon pink wine that is fresh but full of flavour, showing delicate red berry fruit. - Meursault, Clos du Cromin, Patrick Javillier, 2015, France** 89.00  
Clos du Cromin is situated at the beginning of the hill of Volnay. Its aromatic power and its exceptional balance make it one of the “Grands Seigneurs” of Burgundy. The nose is expressive with fruit notes. On the palate there are more fruit notes, particularly apple and pear. The palate is round and displays attractive freshness. This wine is balanced, pleasant and persistent on the palate. Its style is classic Meursault.
- Puligny Montrachet, Francois Carillon 1611, 2016, France** 89.00  
The Carillon family has been living in the small village of Puligny-Montrachet in Burgundy's Côte de Beaune since the sixteenth century. François Carillon is the current steward of the family's land and focuses his attention on making fine, lacy Chardonnay. The 2016 Puligny-Montrachet succeeds in being delicate and light bodied as well as concentrated.
- Chardonnay ‘Collezione Privata’, Isole Olena, Tuscany, 2016, Italy** 69.95  
Paolo De Marchi grafted Chardonnay onto existing vines on the Isole e Olena estate and 1987 became the first vintage of the ‘Collezione De Marchi Chardonnay’ Golden in colour with a rich yet minerally perfume on the nose, with aromas of grilled almonds and butter. On the palate, full and intense, with a perfect balance of ripe, yellow fruit, buttery biscuits and crisp, minerality.
- Caiarossa, Rosso di Toscana IGT, Caiarossa, 2006, Italy** 84.00  
Situated in the heart of the Val di Cecina, on the Tuscan coast. The winery was founded in 1998 and it was eventually acquired in 2004 by Eric Albada Jelgersma, a Dutch entrepreneur with a great passion for wine and also the owner of Château Giscours and Château du Tertre. 23% Sangiovese, 22% Cabernet Franc, 21% Merlot, 12% Cabernet Sauvignon. 8% Alicante, 6% Syrah, 6% Petit Verdot and 2% Mourvedre Aromas of flowers, berries, nuts and mineral. Full-bodied, with chewy tannins and pretty fruit. A hint of wood on the palate, this wine has developed beautifully. Bordeaux meets Tuscany.
- Pinot Noir, Farrside, By Farr, Geelong, 2015, Australia** 89.00  
An elevated offering of pinot noir from By Farr. We all know that whole bunch in fermentation plays a role here, but it's the site/vines that count most for Nick Farr. Love that brambly, forest floor, pickled cherry, sweet spice scent. Has that garrigue, savoury character through and through. Finesse to the max. Svelte, elegance, understated. Delicious, moreish fruit, spice and mineral flavours. Wonderful lingering flavours and aromas. This is an outstanding wine.
- Chateau Beaucastel, Chateauneuf Du Pape Rouge, 2010, France** 134.00  
Beaucastel is one of the top properties in Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Year after year, they produce a multidimensional, age-worthy wine. Although Mourvèdre and Grenache, at about 30% each, comprise the majority of the blend, Beaucastel uses all 13 grape varieties permitted in the appellation, which may explain the phenomenal complexity of their wines, especially the 2010.
- Beaune 1er Cru Greves, Jacques Prieur, 2013, France** 94.00  
In the small, select group of legendary Burgundy domaines is one of the finest: the Domaine Jacques Prieur. The style of wines is one characterized by opulent, aromatic profiles, rich textures and concentrated flavors. Deep crimson in colour, with a cherry rim, this offers red and black fruit and stony minerals on the nose and palate, fresh and aromatic with a heady array of violet and rose, allied to morello cherries the perfume sustained throughout a long, elegant finish.
- Chateau Magdelaine, 1er Grand Cru, St Emillion, 2009, France** 164.00  
From the stable of Jean-Pierre Moueix (owners of Chateau Petrus), this estate has now been absorbed by the nearby and superb Chateau Belair-Monange. One of only 13 1er Grand Cru Classe St Emillions from the whole region, this wine really shone in the great 2009 vintage. Exhibiting gorgeous kirsch liqueur notes with some plum and Asian spice and dense ruby/garnet to the rim, this 2009 is full-bodied, rich, and bigger and more masculine than this wine tends to be. It is a beauty, with loads of fruit, great purity and texture.
