### Vigna Di Gabri, Donnafugata, Sicilia 2018, Italy

The Rallo family has made wine in Marsala since 1851 and their ancient cellars tunnel beneath the city. They were one of the first families to begin making high quality table wine when sales of traditional Marsala started to decline, launching the Donnafugata label in 1983 and championing the potential of the region's native varieties. Today, Donnafugata meaning 'fleeing woman' now has four estates in Sicily. "Vigna di Gabri" is made of the local varietal Ansonica and Catarratto. It takes its name from Gabriella Rallo, who strongly believed in the potentiality of Sicilian white grape varietals. Brilliant straw yellow colour with green reflections. The bouquet is intense and goes from fruity notes like grapefruit and apple (Golden Delicious) to floral scents (acacia) and hints of Mediterranean herbs. The palate is enlivened by a fresh savoury streak. A fine and elegant white, with an intriguing personality and surprising longevity.	10.95 glass 43.95
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### Barbera d'Alba, G.D. Vajra, Langhe, Piedmonte, 2017, Italy

Aldo Vaira's wines are characterised by pristine flavours and clearly defined perfumes. These characters are attributable to the position of his vineyards at about 400 metres above sea level in the village of Vergne in the commune of Barolo. G.D. Vajra was established in 1972 and named after Aldo's father, Giuseppe Domenico Vajra. A traditionalist, Aldo adheres to old style wine making methods, though blends these with new techniques, such as temperature-controlled fermentation, to produce such superbly elegant wines. This wine is bright violet in colour which alludes to the sweet dark fruits, giving this wine a refined elegance. Powerful and rich on the nose, it is concentrated and smooth: rich and fruity while leaving room for hay, tobacco and spices. On the palate, black fruits are layered with mineral graphite notes. Super soft, ripe Trebbiano with lovely white pear and apple.
- Chenin Blanc, Babylons Peak, Swartland, 2018, South Africa** 24.95  
Aromas reminiscent of melon & lychees with soft tropical fruit.
- Sauvignon Blanc, Montes, Casablanca, 2018, Chile** 25.95  
Intense aromatics of herbs and cut grass on the nose, with grapefruit, lime and white peach on the palate.
- Muscadet, Domaine des Herbauges, 2018, France** 26.95  
Bottled straight of the lees to add extra complexity makes this classic bone dry white wine the perfect companion to shellfish & seafood.
- Bianco, Amano, Puglia, 2018, Italy** 26.95  
A blend of Fiano Minutolo and Greco. It has plenty of aromas of ripe pears, orange blossom, white peaches and a hint of jasmine on the nose. Crisp clean flavours with concentration and length. A wine that just makes you smile !
- Torrontes, Amalaya, Calchaqui Valley, Salta, 2018, Argentina** 26.95  
Argentina's white speciality is Torrontes, here with 10% Riesling added. This trophy winning wine is silky on the palate, refreshing and bursting with aromas of citrus, blossom and grapefruit. A great aperitif or for gently spicy dishes.
- Vinho Verde, Reserva, Quinta De Azevedo, 2018, Portugal** 28.95  
This wine is clear and bright with youthful tints and an intense aroma of well-ripened fruit, such as peaches and nectarines. On the palate, it is creamy with aromatic notes of ripe fruit with great concentration.
- Rioja Blanco, Luis Canas, Fermentado en Barrica, 2018, Spain** 29.95  
A beautifully balanced example of white Rioja that straddles the styles of the old and the new. Vibrant citrusy Viura is blended with the more weighty Malvasia and the brief barrel maturation adds a honeyed roundness to the crisp lemony fruit.
- Pinot Grigio, San Simone, Friuli DOC Grave, 2018, Italy** 29.95  
This Pinot Grigio wine from Italy has delicious crisp acidity with lime and pear flavours. The fruit intensity balances with freshness to make this a fine example of great Friuli white wine.
- Sauvignon Blanc, Tinpot Hut, Marlborough, 2018, New Zealand** 36.95  
Aromas of passion fruit, blackcurrant, lemongrass and fresh thyme make this a truly stunning example of a Marlborough Sauvignon.
- Gavi di Gavi, Iugarara, Giustiniana, DOCG, 2018, Italy** 36.95  
Tight, nervy and full of energy, and with a delicious core of tongue-teasing preserved lemon and juicy white apple flesh, this is a superior example of Gavi.
- Riesling, Organic Trocken, Dreissigacker, 2017, Germany** 36.95  
Ripe, clean scented and zesty. The proprietor Jochen Dreissigacker has a dedicated approach to making organic wines of the highest quality and value.
- Chardonnay, Vignoble Peyroli, Mas La Chevaliere, 2016, France** 37.95  
A fine bouquet of white flowers and ripe pear leads to a generous and creamy palate. The finish is long and elegant, with a well balanced acidity to support the stone fruit and floral character
- Vermentino di Sardegna DOC, Tino, Mora & Memo, 2018, Italy** 37.95  
The best vermentino comes from Sardinia & this is the best vermentino in Sardinia. Floral lift on the nose with a great oily texture of stone fruit.

<b>Sangiovese, Terre Allegre, Veneto, IGT 2018, Italy</b>	20.95
This is a lovely soft, spicy Sangiovese. Dark ruby in colour with herbaceous cherries and violets on the nose.	
<b>Carignan, Vieilles Vignes, Mont Rocher, 2018, France</b>	23.95
100% carignan from old vines producing a well-structured wine with dark berry fruit & spice on the palate with a zingy & uplifting finish.	
<b>Merlot, Montes, Colchagua Valley, 2018, Chile</b>	25.95
Vibrant ruby red in colour, this plummy Merlot has hints of vanilla and chocolate with velvety tannins, crisp acidity and a fragrant finish.	
<b>Mencia, Merayo, DO Bierzo, 2018, Spain</b>	26.95
Made from over 80 year old Mencia bush vines. There is no oak treatment to preserve the aromatic fresh red fruit quality of this variety. Fresh and herbal with a hint of spice on the finish.	
<b>Cotes du Rhone, Le Reveur, Guillaume Gonnet, 2017, France</b>	28.95
A blend of Grenache & Syrah, soft but full flavoured with great structure to support the ample fruit.	
<b>Dolomite, Cabernet Franc, Raats, Stellenbosch, 2017, South Africa</b>	29.95
The nose shows dark and red cherry. Dark berries, spiciness and herbs linger on the palate. The wine has great purity of fruit with a hint of wet-stone minerality and a velvet soft finish.	
<b>Shiraz, Thistledown, McLaren Vale, 2018, Australia</b>	32.95
Great depth of ripe plum and blackberry fruit flavours. A full bodied wine with a succulent palate, lively spices and fine velvety tannins.	
<b>Primitivo Di Manduria, Lirica, Produttori Di Manduria, 2016, Italy</b>	34.95
Medium ruby red colour with a pure nose of ripe dark fruits, cherry, plum and sweet spices like ginger and aniseed supported with discreet oak. Palate is round and textured with real freshness, ending with a long and broad spicy finish.	
<b>Cabernet Sauvignon, Jester, Mitolo, McLaren Vale, 2016, Australia</b>	35.95
Bright and fragrant with signature Cabernet Sauvignon aromas of blackcurrant, menthol and tobacco leaf. 20% of the fruit is dried Amarone style creating a full bodied wine with ripe black fruits, dark chocolate and lifted herbaceous notes.	
<b>Pinot Noir, Tinpot Hut, Marlborough 2017, New Zealand</b>	35.95
Aromatics of ripe cherry & plum shine through to the palate & are complimented by subtle spicy notes, silky & lingering finish.	
<b>Malbec, Zuccardi Q, Mendoza, 2017, Argentina</b>	38.95
Deep red, with complex aromas of ripe red fruits. Dark plums and blackberries combine with notes of vanilla and coffee. This expressive wine has firm, sweet tannins giving a delightful finish.	
<b>Rioja Reserva, Bodegas Luis Canas 2013, Spain</b>	42.95
A delicious Reserva from one of the top Rioja Bodegas. It has a dark berry fruit nose and an elegant, flavourful blackberry and raspberry palate together with complex layers of oak, cocoa and balsam hints. Structure, elegance and length.	
<b>Chianti Classico, Fontodi, DOCG, 2015, Italy</b>	45.95
Deep red ruby coloured wine with inviting and elegant violet perfumes, with aromas of ripe morello cherries, wild strawberries and redcurrants. This wine is from one of the most respected producers in Chianti who are embracing minimal intervention.

<p><b>One Man Band, Iona, Elgin, 2014, South Africa</b></p> <p>Syrah, Cab Sauv &amp; Merlot grapes are blended here to produce a delicious silky smooth warming wine with spice and gentle game notes. Layered with fragrant sweet, ripe cherry and blackberry flavours, with almond and white pepper tones. Great with red meat.</p>	48.95
<p><b>Cair, Dominio de Cair Crianza, Ribero del Duero, 2014, Spain</b></p> <p>One of the most award winning wines from the Ribero. Elegant and refined, with an intense and complex nose of blackcurrant fruit, leather and dark chocolate and a wonderfully complex and succulent palate of black fruits with well integrated oak. This wine demonstrates how power and finesse can be brilliantly combined; the flavours go on and on.</p>	49.95
<p><b>'Il Seggio', Poggio al Tesoro, Bolgheri, 2016, Italy</b></p> <p>One of the most exciting estates to have emerged from Italy in recent years, Poggio al Tesoro is a 70 hectare property in Bolgheri acquired in 2002 by the Allegrini family. This stunning Bolgheri blend of 50% Merlot , 20% Cabernet Franc, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Petit Verdot is a deep, intense, full-flavoured red, which shows complex fruit &amp; supple, velvety tannins.</p>	52.95
<p><b>Shiraz. G.A.M, Mitolo, McLaren Vale, 2015 ,Australia</b></p> <p>Intense crimson. Black cherry, plum, subtle mint characters and chocolate with distinct notes of malt, cedar and clove. Bright blackberry and plum on the palate with quality oak flavours of mocha and vanilla. Soft tannins and deep flavours continue on the long finish.</p>	59.95
<p><b>Cabernet Franc, Gasper, Goriška Brda , 2017, Slovenia</b></p> <p>This cab franc has an aromatic nose with aromas of red and dark fruit and notes of capsicum and black pepper. The wine has a smooth, fruit driven palate with lovely, supple tannins and great structure, with a long finish.</p>	59.95
<p><b>Aria di Caiarossa, Rosso di Toscana IGT, Caiarossa, 2012, Italy</b></p> <p>Aria Di Caiarossa is a wine characterised by its crispness and impeccable balance. The wines taste is characterised by its balsamic aromas, black cherry, plum and spice flavours and the fine grained tannins have a sublime velvety texture on the tongue derived by malolactic fermentation. A carefully selected blend of Cabernet Franc, Merlot, Syrah and Cabernet Sauvignon.</p>	59.95
<p><b>Amarone della Valpolicella Classico, Tommasi, 2015, Italy</b></p> <p>Family owned winery using their hillside vineyards for the production of this rich classic wine. Displaying ripe plum and black cherry fruit with notes of mocha, raisin and mineral on the soft luscious finish.</p>	79.95

- Meursault, Clos du Cromin, Patrick Javillier, 2015, France** 89.00  
Clos du Cromin is situated at the beginning of the hill of Volnay. Its aromatic power and its exceptional balance make it one of the “Grands Seigneurs” of Burgundy. The nose is expressive with fruit notes. On the palate there are more fruit notes, particularly apple and pear. The palate is round and displays attractive freshness. This wine is balanced, pleasant and persistent on the palate. Its style is classic Meursault.
- Puligny Montrachet, Francois Carillon 1611, 2016, France** 89.00  
The Carillon family has been living in the small village of Puligny-Montrachet in Burgundy's Côte de Beaune since the sixteenth century. François Carillon is the current steward of the family's land and focuses his attention on making fine, lacy Chardonnay. The 2016 Puligny-Montrachet succeeds in being delicate and light bodied as well as concentrated.
- Riesling Auslese, Dr. Loosen Erdener Pralat, Mosel, 1993, Germany** 139.00  
A small slice of perfection, the four-acre Erdener Prälat vineyard produces some of the greatest wines in the Mosel valley. Its 100 percent south-facing slopes, red slate soil and extraordinarily warm microclimate yield wines of unequalled power and nobility. Simply stunning !
- Caiarossa, Rosso di Toscana IGT, Caiarossa, 2010, Italy** 89.00  
Situated in the heart of the Val di Cecina, on the Tuscan coast. The winery was founded in 1998 and it was eventually acquired in 2004 by Eric Albada Jelgersma, a Dutch entrepreneur with a great passion for wine and also the owner of Château Giscours and Château du Tertre. 26% Merlot, 23% Cabernet Franc, 22% Cabernet Sauvignon, 19% Sangiovese, 12% Petit Verdot. Aromas of flowers, berries, nuts and mineral. Full-bodied, with chewy tannins and pretty fruit. This wine has developed beautifully. Bordeaux meets Tuscany.
- Pinot Noir, Farrside, By Farr, Geelong, 2016, Australia** 89.00  
An elevated offering of pinot noir from By Farr. We all know that whole bunch in fermentation plays a role here, but it's the site/vines that count most for Nick Farr. Love that brambly, forest floor, pickled cherry, sweet spice scent. Has that garrigue, savoury character through and through. Finesse to the max. Svelte, elegance, understated. Delicious, moreish fruit, spice and mineral flavours. Wonderful lingering flavours and aromas. This is an outstanding wine.
- Chateau Beaucastel, Chateaneuf Du Pape Rouge, 2001, France** 154.00  
Beaucastel is one of the top properties in Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Although all thirteen grape varieties are present, lending this red wine a rare complexity, Mourvèdre (30%) and Grenache (30%) are overwhelmingly dominant. Deeper ruby in color, mostly opaque. Cherries, raspberries, some earthiness and nice minerality on the nose. On the palate, this is medium to full bodied. Plenty of depth with nice layering in the glass. A lot of fruit left; cherries and raspberries and some black raspberries, over a dry earthy quality. Enjoy !
- Beaune 1er Cru Greves, Jacques Prieur, 2013, France** 89.00  
In the small, select group of legendary Burgundy domaines DJP is one of the finest. Deep crimson in colour, with a cherry rim, this offers red and black fruit and stony minerals on the nose and palate, fresh and aromatic with a heady array of violet and rose, allied to morello cherries the perfume sustained throughout a long, elegant finish.
- Chateau Magdelaine, 1er Grand Cru, St Emillion, 2009, France** 164.00  
From the stable of Jean-Pierre Moueix (owners of Chateau Petrus), this estate has now been absorbed by the nearby and superb Chateau Belair-Monange. One of only 13 1er Grand Cru Classe St Emillions from the whole region, this wine really shone in the great 2009 vintage. Exhibiting gorgeous kirsch liqueur notes with some plum and Asian spice and dense ruby/garnet to the rim, this 2009 is full-bodied, rich, and bigger and more masculine than this wine tends to be. It is a beauty, with loads of fruit, great purity and texture.
